





Stick Map Instructions

A stick map is an abstract representation of the rally route.

1. Start at the dot. Continue through the stick instructions in numerical order, toward the arrow. Then continue on to the next consecutively numbered route instruction. (You are the dot – you want to be the arrow.)
2. The continuous line represents the rally route. The short sticks represent other roads at intersections. The shape or angle of the stick instructions does not necessarily bear any resemblance to the appearance of the intended intersection. Only rally roads are shown, unless otherwise indicated on the map.
3. Stick instructions may include reference to signs, landmarks, mileages or time to identify the specific location at which to execute the instruction. References which are not at an intersection will be indicated by a dot on the continuous line.

Sample stick map:

Stick Map Instruction	Interpretation
1. 	At the first intersection of three rally roads, leave one road to your left. (Could be (1) straight at a side road on the left, (2) right at a T, or (3) right at a side road.)
2. 	At the next intersection of five rally roads, leave two roads to your left and one road to your right.
3. 	Cross a bridge, then, at the next intersection of four rally roads, leave two roads to your left, and change your average speed to 30 m.p.h. (Could be right at a cross road.)
4. 	At the next intersection of three rally roads and having a sign reading "ARCO," leave one road to your right.
